

## **MOVING ABROAD**

#### **6 MONTHS BEFORE THE MOVE**

## 1. Visa and Work Permit

### Check Entry and Residency Requirements:

Research the entry and residency regulations of the destination country. Determine if a visa or residence permit is required and apply accordingly.

### EU or Non-EU Country:

For moves within the EU, a visa is generally not required, but there may still be registration obligations. For non-EU countries, a visa or work permit is often necessary. Begin the application process early, as it can take several months.

### Familiarize Yourself with the Destination Country:

If not already done, consider taking a trip to the destination country to get a better understanding of it. It's essential to experience the country beyond a tourist perspective and to engage with its culture and mindset.

#### Research Culture and Markets:

Learn about the culture, mentality of the residents, and the housing and job markets.

### Start Job and Housing Searches:

Take initial steps toward finding a job and housing in the destination country.

# 2. Check Important Documents

#### Ensure Validity of Passport and ID:

Confirm that your passport and/or ID card have at least six months of validity beyond your departure date. Renew them if needed.

#### Driver's License:

Verify if your current driver's license is accepted in the destination country. If necessary, obtain an international driver's license.

## 3. Finances and Insurance

### Plan Moving and Living Costs:

Estimate the costs associated with your move and daily living in the new country.

#### Adjust Insurance Policies:

Review and update your health, liability, and household insurance policies. Research the available insurance options in the destination country.

#### **Understand Tax Implications:**

Investigate the tax implications of relocating and determine if you qualify for relocation allowances or tax benefits related to your move abroad.









### **3 MONTHS BEFORE THE MOVE**

## 1. Visa and Work Permit

Continue Searching for Housing:

Proceed with the search for accommodation and prepare rental agreements.

Prepare Documents for Housing Registration:

Ensure you have all necessary documents for registering your residence in the destination country.

## 3. Check Important Documents

Deregister Services:

Notify utility providers, local authorities, and other services about your departure.









### 1 MONTH BEFORE THE MOVE

## 1. Deregistration from Authorities (Resident Registration Office):

- Complete the deregistration process with the local authorities.
- If you own a car, arrange for its sale or prepare for import into the destination country. Note that importing a car can be expensive and complicated in many countries.

## 2. Moving Preparations:

- Pack the belongings you plan to take with you and create a detailed inventory for customs purposes.
- Organize packing materials and consider purchasing moving insurance to protect your items.

### 3. Finances and Bank Accounts:

- Open a bank account in the destination country and familiarize yourself with its tax requirements.
- Review ongoing contracts and subscriptions in Switzerland and cancel or pause those no longer needed.

## 4. Pets and Import Regulations:

- Research the import regulations for pets in your destination country.
- Arrange for necessary vaccinations, health certificates, and other required documents to ensure compliance.

### 1 WEEK BEFORE THE MOVE

# 1. Travel Preparations

- Ensure all travel documents, such as visas, passports, and tickets, are readily accessible.
- Double-check that these documents are valid and in order.

# 2. Final Preparations

- Deregister your residence and cancel or transfer contracts for insurance, internet, electricity, and other services.
- Notify all relevant parties, including banks, post office, and employers, about your new address.





### **AFTER THE MOVE**

## 1. Registration in the Destination Country

- Register with local authorities for your residence, tax identification number, and social security number.
- Re-register your vehicle and arrange for insurance in the new country.

# 2. Finalize Moving Preparations

- Obtain necessary insurance policies in the destination country, such as health, accident, and household insurance.
- Check if you need to remain insured in Switzerland if you are liable for taxes in multiple countries.

### 3. Finances and Utilities

- Open a local bank account if not already done.
- Set up internet, phone, and other utility contracts in the new location.

- Start making connections in your new community and adapt to the environment.
- If necessary, enroll in language courses to help you adjust to the new culture and surroundings.
